

GOP COVID Relief Payments

Summary: Several GOP senators have proposed an alternative* to the Biden administration's proposed COVID relief bill. Among other provisions, the plan would offer direct payments of \$1,000 per adult (with an additional \$500 for dependents), phasing out at a rate of 10 cents per dollar above \$40,000 in income (\$80,000 for married filers). PWBM projects that this provision would cost \$225 billion.
